## **Biography of Maria Austria**

March 19, 1915: Marie Karoline Oestreicher was born as the youngest of four children of the doctor Karl Oestreicher (1864–1915) and his wife Clara, née Kisch (1871–1945), in Karlsbad (Karlovy Vary) in Bohemia, then Austria-Hungary, now Czech Republic.

- **1933:** Graduates from Grammar School in Karlovy Vary
- **1933–1936:** Trained as a photographer at the Federal Institution for Graphic Education and Research in Vienna
- **1934–1935:** Unpaid internship at the Willinger Photo Studio in Vienna
- **1935–1937:** First photo publications in Viennese pictorial magazines
- **1937:** Move from Vienna to Amsterdam; founding of the *Model en Foto Austria* studio together with her sister Lisbeth Oestreicher, who designs knitwear
- **1939:** Adoption of the artist's name Maria Austria
- **1942:** Abandonment of the studio; Lisbeth is interned at the Westerbork transit camp. Marriage to the German businessman Hans Bial, who also has to report to Westerbork. Maria Austria does not comply with this request from the National Socialists.
- **1943:** From the end of September Maria Austria lives in hiding and is active in the resistance: she carries messages and provides photos for false identity cards. She meets the Dutchman Henk Jonker, who becomes her life partner.
- **1945:** Maria Austria's mother is murdered in the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp; her brother and sister-in-law die shortly after the liberation as a result of the concentration camp imprisonment. Her sister and her brother's three daughters survive. Shortly after the end of the war the photo agency Particam was founded together with Jonker and other colleagues. Divorce from Hans Bial.
- **1945–1975:** Works as a press photographer and photojournalist with a focus on music performances, dance, and theater
- **1950:** Marries Henk Jonker
- **1954:** Photo documentation *Het Achterhuis*
- **1955:** Attends the Salzburg Festival
- **1960:** Only visit to Vienna after emigration
- **1963:** Separation from Henk Jonker
- **1965:**First trip to Israel for the opening of the Israel Museum in JerusalemPays a visit to Josephine Baker in France
- **1967:** Second trip to Israel
- **1965–1975:** In-house photographer at the avant-garde Mickery Theater

January 10, 1975: Maria Austria dies unexpectedly, barely recovered from a severe flu.
